DUCK DISTANCE CHALLENGE

All profits will go to MARS. See rules in this premium.

Please note that parking is a distance from crating in the service center, but there will be a drop off area by the service center.

Lunch is at noon – there is a Café in the Event Center, and you can also go to the visitor’s center.

Judges’ dogs will be joining in the fun, and running their dogs. If one ring is closed, please check to see if any other rings are ready for you to run.

Trial Site/Noise/Distractions

Plan and train for naturally occurring dog trial noises, such as printers, doors opening, crated dogs, lively conversation and laughter, possible barking and background music. Sound sensitive teams will not be accommodated, as each team must be judged in a similar environment. Purina Farms is a public place and can be packed with people/dogs and may be noisy. The general public has access to this site during the trial.

Reactivity

The entrance points/crating area will be quite busy, and not conducive to an extremely reactive dog. We are not able to change the environment for a specific dog, as the trial experience should be similar for all entrants. Expect 3 dogs in line for each of the trial rings, in addition to dogs exiting the ring in the staging area.

Handler Discrimination classes are titling classes in which the targeted scent is that of the handler themselves. Handlers are required to provide their own scented articles in a plastic bag, cotton gloves, cotton sock, cotton balls or Q-Tips depending on the level. We prefer that you bring TWO scented articles so we can hide both at the same time. Three qualifying scores are required to earn titles in each class. Handlers may utilize any method they feel is best to scent their article. Suggestions include rubbing the article on the handler's body or storing the article in the handler's dirty laundry.

RIBBONS AWARDS AND PRIZES

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place *Blue*
Second Place *Red*
Third Place *Yellow*
Fourth Place *White*
Qualifying Score *Dark Green*

A New Title ribbon will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.

Level Title rosettes will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title for the entire level.

High in Trial

Eligibility/Rules:

- Entered in all elements offered for the same level (Container, Interior, Exterior, Buried, and Handler Discrimination)
- Qualify in all runs for that level
- One High In Trial winner is chosen for each level (no separate High In Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections)
- The High in Trial is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times across the elements will be summed and the faster-finishing team will win.
- Rosette for Prize

Detective Classes

- A special prize (to be determined) will be given for 1st place in both Trials

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

ENTRY FEES

Scent Work Each Entry (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording fee) \$25.00/Run
Detective Entry (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording fee) \$40.00/Run
Farm Dog Each Entry (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording fee) \$25.00/Trial

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the

Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION - There will be a wait list. Wait list will be closed May 22nd, 2018 at 6pm.

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include crating, warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

The **Handler's Briefing** will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing. 1st dog to run in the class is considered the Demo Dog, changes to hide placement and maximum time may be made

A **warm-up area** will be available. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior their run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.

All exhibitors are responsible for understanding the rules and should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Scent Work Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

Ringside: Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Exhibitor Check in: At check-in you will receive your armband number. Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email. Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered. Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

The **A/B Sections:** The A class is for beginners. Those dogs who have earned a title in that element (in AKC or in another organization), and those handlers who have worked as professional detection dog handlers must enter the B section. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/divisions. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of qualifying scores.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email, fax. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. Inquiries may be directed to Connie Jankowski at cjankowski3@gmail.com. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Viewing: There will be an area to watch the trials. If you are in the class, do not watch until after you have completed your run. Conversation is acceptable and encouraged, but do not give the hide away though! No double handling. Do not bring dogs into the viewing area. Viewing is allowed for all runs where appropriate.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5, Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

Crating space will be available.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The American Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The American Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the American Kennel Club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. Nothing may be hanging from the dog's collar or harness, except that a wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

PLACEMENT

- Highest Number of Qualifications (maximum of 10, including HD for all Levels except Detective, which has a maximum of 2)
- Tie-Breaker #1: Least Number of Faults
- Tie-Breaker #2: Fastest Combined Time

Special Notes - Detective Class - If there are no qualifications, add total number of hides found (both rounds) minus total number of faults (both rounds), highest number wins. Use Tie-Breakers above.

Thursday Night, approximately 5 pm – Sign up on site.

Support Mini Aussie Rescue (MARS) by entering Michiana Scent Work Club's first AKC Scent Work Non-Regular Event. All profits go to MARS. \$10/run.

Duck Distance Challenge - 3 baby pools (ponds) with water will each contain a floating rubber duck. Ponds will be numbered from 1 to 3. One of the 3 rubber ducks will have Birch dropped directly on its cute little head.

Odor is sure to contaminate the ponds, but the challenge is to figure out which duck has the odor regardless.

Pools will be at a distance of at least 20' from the handler who must remain in the lawn chair at all times and sip on their drink. When the handler knows which duck pond has the hide, they will call the number of the Pond - 1, 2 or 3.

1. Start line - Competitor will sit in a lawn chair with their trusty canine on leash.
2. They will be handed a beverage and asked to put on very stylish sunglasses that you actually cannot see through.
3. Hide Steward will set the hide.
4. Judge will say "Find the duck".
5. Handler will take off their sunglasses, remove their dog's leash, and send their dog, all while holding on to their beverage.
6. Time begins when handler removes leash. Time ends when the handler calls 1, 2 or 3.

Correct calls win you a little rubber duck. Fastest team will win a big rubber duck. Thank you for your support of Mini Aussie Rescue! Prize - stress reliever ducks with the AKC Scent Work logo.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

We understand that exhibitors may have move ups. Please submit any move-ups by Monday, May 20th, 2018.

After completion of trials, High in Trial awards will be announced

RIBBONS: Please do not ask the secretary when the placement ribbons will be complete. They will be put on the awards table as soon as they are printed.

PICTURES: Be sure to get a picture on the deck with your dog and ribbons. Judges will be available after competition of both trials for pictures.

SELF SERVICE LINEUP: There will 6 staging areas with 3 chairs, one for each of the 6 judges. We are counting on exhibitors to keep these 3 chairs FULL and ready to go for each ring at all times! If you are ready to run, put your magnet on the board and go to the next chair if they are open.

Process:

1. When you are ready to run and have your dog, put your magnet on the board. Sit in one of the chairs if there are any open. You will move up a chair each time an exhibitor enters the ring, to open up the last chair.
2. If there are not any chairs open, relax and wait – only 4 magnets on the board at a time.
3. After your run, potty your dog, get a drink, whatever you need to do to prepare for the next run. When you are ready to go, put your magnet on the board for the next event. Do not put your magnet on the board unless you are ready to run and have your dog with you.
4. Repeat above until all of your runs are complete.

CONFLICTS: We are aware that there will be many conflicts with 6 judges running dogs at the same time. The magnet system helps to make it so you can go when you are ready to go, and not be rushed. On the other hand, be sure to start getting ready for your next run as soon as possible. Please help us to keep the seats full and at least 4 magnets on the board for each judge.

RING PRIORITY: Detective Rings are given top priority (Judge Penelope). Interior/Exterior Rings are given next highest priority (Judge Holly/Cynthia). Workers/Judges will run their dogs first so they can help with the class, and get back to judging. Classes may be paused so judges can run their dogs.

Do not worry about conflicts, as we will accommodate. But please also be as efficient as possible, and make sure we always have 3 dogs ready to run at all times for all judges.

HANDLER DISCRIMINATION: Be sure to bring your glove/sock/Q-tips/Cotton balls depending on your level. Bring **TWO** so we can set both trials at the same time.

INSIDE/OUTSIDE CLASSES (Grass/Mulch/Turf/gravel, etc.) – dress for the weather, we will run in
